SUFFOLK COUNTY COUNCIL

The Suffolk County Council (High Road West, Felixstowe) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1996

Notice is hereby given that, on 13th December 1996, Suffolk County Council made the above Order under sections 1, 2, 3 and 4 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, the effect of which is to extend the length of prohibited waiting at the junction of High Road West and Hamilton Road, covering the area of the roundabout. Double yellow lines will extend into High Road West for approximately 15 metres past the traffic island near the roundabout.

Exemptions to the waiting restrictions allow a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary to board or alight and for goods to be loaded or unloaded; for building, industrial or demolition works; for the maintenance of the road or the services therein, and for certain other purposes specified in the Order. There are also the usual exemptions for disabled persons' vehicles.

A copy of the Order, which comes into effect on 20th December 1996, and a set of plans showing the roads affected, may be inspected at my office between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m., Monday to Thursday and 9 a.m. and 4 p.m. on Friday; also at Felixstowe Library, Crescent Road, between 9.30 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. on Tuesday and Thursday; 9.30 a.m. and 1 p.m. on Wednesday; 9.30 a.m. and 7.30 p.m. on Friday; and between 9.30 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Saturday.

The original notice of intention relating to this Order appeared in *The London Gazette* on 21st October 1996. The effect of the Order as made is as in that notice.

If anyone wishes to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, or on the grounds that any of the requirements of that Act or any Instrument made under it have not been complied with in relation to the Order, they may within 6 weeks of the date on which the Order was made apply to the High Court for this purpose.
