WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981

North Yorkshire County Council Langeliffe, Settle Limestone Pavement Order No. 4 (Langcliffe and Settle) 1996

Notice is hereby given that on 28th January 1997 the Secretary of State for the Environment acting under the provisions of section 34(2) and paragraphs 3(1) and 6(2) of Schedule 11 to the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981, having considered the unopposed North Yorkshire County Council Langcliffe, Settle Limestone Pavement Order No. 4 (Langcliffe and Settle) 1996 which took effect when it was made on 29th November 1996, decided to take no action on the Order. This means that the Order continues in force.

The Order designates the lands described in the First Schedule of the Order in accordance with section 34(2) of the Act and prohibits the removal or disturbance of limestone on or in that land

Copies of the Order and map referred to in it and of this notice have been deposited at the offices of the North Yorkshire County

Council, County Secretary's Department, County Hall, Northallerton, North Yorkshire DL7 8AD, and may be seen, free of charge, at all reasonable hours.

Any person who is aggrieved by the Order and desires to question its validity on the grounds that it is not within the powers of section 34 of the said Act of 1981, or that any of the requirements of Schedule 11 of that Act had not been complied with in relation to it, may, within 6 weeks from the date of this notice, make an application to the High Court under paragraph 7 of Schedule 11 to the 1981 Act.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 247 of the above Act to authorise the stopping-up of a part of northern footway of Crosslands Avenue, Norwood Green, Southall.

If the Order is made, the stopping-up will be authorised only in order to enable the development described in the schedule to this notice to be carried out in accordance with the planning permission granted by the London Borough of Hounslow to Lawrence and Wrightson on 12th October 1993 under reference 00328/1P2.

The proposed Order will require an improvement to Crosslands Avenue.
