#### The Berwick-upon-Tweed (Off-street Parking Places) (Amendment) Order 1997

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the Borough of Berwickupon-Tweed intend to make the above Order under section 35(1) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, to amend The Berwickupon-Tweed (Off-street Parking Places) Order 1993 (as amended) ("the 1993 Order").

- (iii) to increase from 70p to £1 the hourly rate charge in the Foul Ford (rear of Bank of Scotland) parking place; this charge to be reduced, from 1st October 1997, to 80p.
- (iv) to increase the differential charges at Castlegate, Seahouses, Holy Island, Beadnell, Bamburgh and Wooler (Bus Station) parking places; the new charges to be  $\pounds 1$  up to one hour,  $\pounds 1.30$ up to two hours,  $\pounds 1.50$  up to three hours,  $\pounds 1.70$  up to four hours and  $\pounds 2$  in excess of four hours, these charges to be reduced, from 1st October 1997, to 80p up to one hour, 90p up to two hours,  $\pounds 1$  up to three hours,  $\pounds 1.10$  up to four hours and  $\pounds 1.30$  in excess of four hours.
- (v) to increase from £3 to £3.10 the daily charge for coaches at all Council parking places which ordinarily accommodate such vehicles in the Borough of Berwick-upon-Tweed.
- (vi) to introduce a daily charge at Coxon's Lane parking place of £2; this charge to be reduced to £1 20 from 1st October 1997.

### CAERPHILLY COUNTY BOROUGH COUNCIL

#### Caerphilly County Borough Council, Spur of Crescent Road, Caerphilly (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1997

Any person wishing to question the validity of the Order or any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulations Act 1984, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any Instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks from 10th March 1997, apply to the High Court for this purpose.
