Redland Aggregates (UK) Limited and Pioneer Aggregates (UK) Limited, applied to Hertfordshire County Council, as mineral planning authority, on 16th November 1995, for planning permission for that development under application number 3/1653-95. They subsequently appealed to the Secretary of State for the Environment under section 78 of the above Act against failure of the mineral planning authority to determine the application.
