Br. James's, OStober 30. HIS being the Birth-Day of His Royal Highnels the Prince of Wales, there was a very numerous and fplendid Appearance at Court of the Nobility and other Perfons of Diffinction : And at Night there were Illuminations, and other Publick Demonstrations of Joy.

Demonstrations of Joy. Venice, OEt. 23. The Princels of Wallachia, and her two Sons, are on their Way hither, from Rome. Yesterday the Emperour's Am baffadour communicated to the Doge, and to all the foreign Ministers here, the News which had been brought to him by an Express of the Surrender of Temeswaer to the Imperialists, and received their Compluments of Congratulation upon it. On this Occafion Te Deum was fung to Day in the Ducal Church of St. Mark, in Prefence of the Doge and Senate. 'Tis advifed from Rome, that the Pope's Gallies are returned to Civita Vecchia, a great Number of the Men on board being fick, and 300 were left fick at Malta, where the Pope's 4 Men of War ftill remain. The Neapolitan Gallies, which had been cruifing in the Adriatick, for the Secu-rity of that Part of the Coafts of that King-dom, are returned to Naples. Their Crews being extremely diminished by Mortality, 'tis imputed to unwholesome Provisions, and the Undertaker, who victualled them, is feized and imprisoned, in order to be tried; and left any Shipping from the Levant, by put-ting into the Ports and fetting Men afhore, might bring in contagious Diffempers, ftrict Orders were fent not to fuffer any Ships from thence to touch at any Port of the King-dom of Naples. The Spanish and Portuguese dom of Naples. Squadrons had therefore been obliged to put into Meffina. As for the Fleet of this Republick, we have had no Advices from it fince the 17th of last Month, when it had its Station between Modon and Coron.

Vienna, Off. 24. Our frescheft Advices from the Camp before Temeswaer are of the 16th Instant, three Days after the Capitulation. They tell us, that the Citizens, who were numerous and rich, compelled the Garrison to furrender, that they might preserve their Effects and Families. The Bombs which were thrown into the Town, terrified the Citizens into that Resolution. The Place is much stronger than had been imagined, and might have found the Imperialists Work for

fix Weeks longer, in the ordinary Forms of a Siege; which is uit not only have colt a very confiderable Number of Men, but 'tis certain our Cavalry would in that Time have been reduced to a very bad Condition. Above 20000 Souls have left the Place; in which about 10000 Raffians, most of them very poor, remain.

Genea, Oct. 27. By a British Ship which is come in here from Port Mahon we have received an Account, that Admiral Baker is returned thither with his Squadron from Tripoli and Tunis. A Man of War, bought in England for the King of Sicily, arrived a few Days ago at Nice, much disabled by a violent Storm in her Voyage, 'Tis advised from Berne, that M. Manning, Refident of the King of Great Britain, arrived there last Week.

of Great Britain, arrived there laft Week. Bruffels, Nov. 4. The Citizens of Antwerp, notwithstanding all the Ways of Mildnefs and Perswasion, made use of these two Years past, to induce them to confent to the Payment of the usual Subfidy, still perfist in their Denial, upon frivolous Pretences; which does not on-ly shew a bad Example to the other Cities, but also retards the Payment of the Troops affigned on this Province, and occasions other Inconveniencies. On the 29th paft Count Ki-nigfegg held a Conference at his own Houfe with the Chancellor, two Counfellors, and the Fiscal of the Council of Brabant, and M. Swartz, Counfellor of the Council of Finances, to concert proper Measures and Expedients for removing these Difficulties, and bringing the Authors of this Difobedience to Reafon; the Refult of which was to represent to the Marquis de Prié at his Arrival, the Necessity of changing, as foon as poffible, the Magif-trates of that City, fuppoing him to be veft-ed with fufficient Power and Authority to that Purpole. The Magiftrates of Mechlen have at last submitted to the Order fignified to them by the third and last Letter of the prefent Imperial Minister; and they have, in Consequence thereof, promised to pay their whole Subfidy of 36000 Florins to the Re-ceiver General's Office : Whereupon the March of the two Companies of Archers and Halbardiers they were threatned with, has been countermanded. The Princels d'llenghien, who was twice cast with Costs and Charges, in a Law Suit for 1300000 Florins, which she has carried on feveral Years against the Marquis de Deynse, has at last, by Appeal, gained,

her Caule in a grand Revision, from which there is no further Appeal. Letters from Ghent advise, that the Baron d'Oudenhove, first Eschevin, which is the same as Burgo-Master of that Town, died on the 29th of last Month, and M. Pertelsberg Niculandt has The fucceeded him in that Employment. States of Flanders are come to this Town in a Body, to prefent to the Imperial Minister the Subfidy of one Million of Florins for this current Year ; which they have lately granted for the Emperor's Service in these Provinces. Sunday next is appointed a Day of Thankf-giving for the taking of Temelwaer, and the other Succeffes against the Turks, during this Campaign. This Day at Noon a triple Difcharge of the Cannon on the Ramparts of this Place was fired, and the same will be done at Night, in Honour of St. Charles de Borromeo, the Emperor's Patron. We have not yet any certain certain Account when the Marquis de Prié is to come hither from the Hague.

Admiralty-Office, Nov. 1. By Letters from Cadiz of the 6th Inftant, O. S. we have certain Advice, that befides the Sally Rover of 8 Guns, taken in May last by Capt. Del Garno in His Majefty's Ship the Hind of 20 Guns, he lately came up with one of their Corfairs of 24 Guns, off Cape Cantine, but five Days out of Sally, which, after an Engagement of two Hours and an half, ftruck to him, and was not above a Quarter of an Hour in his Possession before the Sunk ; the Weather was fo bad that all the Moors on board her but 38 were drown'd. We have likewise further Accounts that by the Appearance of His Majefty's Ship the Bridgewater off of Sally, two of their Ships of 16 Guns each, were forced on that Bar, where they faranded.
