

*Lisbon, Nov. 14.* On the 28th of last Month the King of Portugal, accompanied by his Brother Don Antonio, the Duke of Cadaval, the Gentlemen of his Bed Chamber, Father Podroffi, and Sig. Mendonza, set out for Alentejo, having left the Queen here to Govern in his Absence. His Majesty has been at Evora, Estremos, Villa Viciosa, and Elvas, and is now at Villa Viciosa. His Majesty was perswaded to make this Progress for his Health: The Time of his Return is uncertain, but 'tis believed he will be back by the End of this Month. Sig. Ferrajo, a Neapolitan, the Pope's Nuncio Extraordinary to this Court, embarked on the 13th Instant on board a Dutch Merchant-Ship for Calais, in order to go thence to Switzerland, where he is to reside. On the 5th Instant came in Captain Falkingham, in His Britannick Majesty's Ship the Gibraltar, from Newfoundland. The Gloucester, Capt. Passenger, and the Dragon, Capt. Masters, are also arrived here from Admiral Baker. By Letters from Gibraltar of the 23d past, it appears that the Moors are now more inclined to come to Terms of an Accommodation than when Admiral Cornwall arrived there; and that upon his Complaint, they had Cloathed all the Prisoners, fed them well, and freed them from Work.

*Hambourg, Nov. 24.* Letters from Berlin of the 21st Instant advise, that the Day before Orders were dispatched from thence to deliver up the Countess of Cossel into the Hands of the King of Poland's Officers, at whose Instance she was seized some Time ago in Hall. The King of Poland has on this Occasion written a Letter himself to his Prussian Majesty, with Assurances that she shall be set at Liberty as soon as she has restored certain Papers which he demands. Our last Letters from Mecklenbourg advise, that the Czar went from Swerin on the 21st Instant, in order to have an Interview with the King of Prussia at Havelberg. At his Departure from Swerin 'twas the Talk there, that his Consort is to come to this Town, and that his Czarish Majesty will come hither to her in a few Days.

*Brussels, Nov. 25.* The Forfeiture of the Estates of those who followed King Philip, whereof mention was made some Time since, is on the Representations of the Merchants of these Provinces, only to extend to the Military Persons who are now actually in King Philip's Service: And the Fiscal and Attorney-General of the Council of Brabant, have received Orders to discharge their Duty, by prosecuting, pursuant to his Imperial Majesty's

Decree, all Military Persons therein concerned, and to proceed to the forfeiting of their Estates accordingly. The States of the Province of Luxemburg, whose Constitution and Administration of Justice differs from that of this Province, have lately appointed the Count de Lanoy, Administrator of the County of Namur, to be One of the Seven Justiciaries of the Court called *La Cour Noble*, in the Place of the Son of the Count d' Autel, heretofore Governour of the Town of Namur, who is lately deceased. The aforesaid States have also made pressing Instances with the Imperial Minister, that the Value of the Coin in their Province, might be augmented: But the Mint-Master General of these Provinces, has represented the Inconveniencies that would attend that Augmentation; whereupon the Imperial Minister has asked the Advice of the Chamber of Accounts of Brabant, under whose Jurisdiction the aforesaid Province lies with respect to this Particular. On the 16th Instant, about Five in the Afternoon, the Marquis de Prié arrived in this Town, under a Triple Discharge of the Artillery on the Ramparts, accompanied by the Archbishop of Mechlin, the Bishops of Ghent and Ruremond, the Governour of this Place, and a great Number of the Nobility, some of whom met him at Mechlin, and others at the Three Fountains, and accompanied his Excellency to his Lodgings, where he received the Compliments of a great Number of Persons of all Ranks. Yesterday Morning his Excellency was complimented by the Foreign Ministers who reside here, and by the Courts of Justice and Colleges, on his Arrival and Entering upon the Administration of the Government of the Austrian Netherlands; and he was afterwards entertained at Dinner (with Count Kinigslegg) by Count Vehlen, Commander in Chief of the Forces in these Countries. Last Night the States of the Province of Hainaut, arrived here from Mons, and this Morning they made their Compliment of Congratulation to his Excellency, who was very splendidly entertained at Dinner by Count Kinigslegg, whose Administration ceased on the Arrival of the Marquis. The German Letters, which arrived on the 16th, brought us the ill News of the Death of the Archduke; on which Occasion, 'tis said, there will be Orders for every Body to go into Mourning, as soon as the Imperial Minister shall have received the Notification of it in Form, from the Court of Vienna.
