1. Where the consignment:

originates from an establishment approved in accordance (i) with Council Directive 90/667/EEC (laying down the veterinary rules for the disposal and processing of animal waste for its placing on the market and for the prevention of pathogens in feedingstuffs of animal or fish origin and amending Directive 90/425/EEC), it must be accompanied by a commercial document indicating the approval number of the establishment of production and the nature of the product;

Or:

(ii) originates from an establishment registered in accordance with the Council Directive 90/667/EEC, it must be accompanied by a health certificate issued and signed by an official veterinarian showing the registration number of the establishment of production, the methods of treatment used on the consignment and the result of the salmonella tests carried out.

2. Sampling

- (a) Prior to importing material under this licence importers must advise the Divisional Veterinary Manager, in whose Division the consignee establishment is situated, of their arrangements for receiving imported consignments and thereafter must report the arival of consignments to the Divisional Veterinary Manager in accordance with his or her instructions.
- (b) Any material imported under this licence shall be made available, if so required, for inspection and/or sampling by an officer of the Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food any appointment during the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. Monday to Friday.
- (c) Where the result of sampling carried out under 3(b) above gives a positive result, the Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food may require the consignment to be re-exported, subjected to futher processing, destroyed or diverted to a use other than feeding of livestock.

3. The certificate required above must be the original certificate except in the case of products entering Great Britain via another Member States which, in accordance with Article 11.2(a) of Council Directive $90/675/EEC(^1)$, must be accompanied by a copy of the original certificate authenticated by and provided by the official veterinarian at the border inspection post of entry to the Community, together with a document signed by the official veterinarian at the border inspection post of entry to the Community

confirming that veterinary checks have been carried out to his or her satisfaction. However, in the case of products transported by air or sea which have been transhipped in a port or airport in another Member State and which, in accordance with Article 8.4 of Council Directive 90/675/EEC, have not been subject to veterinary checks in that Member State the certificate must be the original certificate.
