Pursuant to the provisions of Article 1(2) of the above-mentioned Orders, the Secretary of State for Foreign and Commonwealth Affairs hereby gives notice that, by Resolution 1156 (1998) adopted on 16th March 1998, the Security Council of the United Nations has decided to terminate, with immediate effect, the prohibitions on the sale or supply to Sierra Leone of petroleum and petroleum products referred to in paragraph 6 of resolution 1132 (1997), which imposed certain measures in relation to Sierra Leone.

In accordance with the provisions of the said Article 1(2), the operation of the above-mentioned Orders ceased to have effect on 16th March 1998 to the extent required by the above-mentioned decision.

The Security Council has decided also in Resolution 1156 to review the other prohibitions referred to in Resolution 1132 (1997) in accordance with paragraph 17 of that Resolution and in the light of developments and further discussion with the Government of Sierra Leone. These prohibitions remain in place at the present time.

HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

The Carmarthenshire County Council (Pont Abraham to Carmarthen Trunk Road A48—Grade Separated Junction to Middleton Hall Botanical Gardens) (Side Roads) Order 1997

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he has confirmed the above Order which was made under section 14 of the Highways Act 1980 and which, as confirmed, authorises the Council:

- (a) to improve, raise, lower or otherwise alter highways,
- (b) to stop up a highway, and
- (c) to construct new highways

all in the vicinity of the classified roads which the Council are proposing to construct to connect the A48 Trunk Road with the B4310.

Copies of the Order, as confirmed, and of the relevant plan may be inspected, free of charge, at all reasonable hours at the offices of Carmarthenshire County Council (Director of Legal and Administrative Services, Room 54), County Hall, Carmarthen; the Council's Transport and Engineering Department, Llanstephan Road, Johnstown, Carmarthen; Carmarthen Library, St. Peter's Street, Carmarthen and the Planning Inspectorate, Crown Buildings, Cathays Park, Cardiff.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with, may, within 6 weeks of 25th March 1998, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or any provision contained therein.
