### NOTICE OF SEIZURE UNDER THE CUSTOMS AND EXCISE MANAGEMENT ACT 1979

To Whom it may concern,  
and also Antonio de Sousa Camacho, of 3 Keeble Crescent, Kinson, Bournemouth, Dorset

Pursuant to section 139(6) of the Customs and Excise Management Act 1979, and paragraph 1 of Schedule 3 thereto, the Commissioners of Customs and Excise hereby give notice that by virtue of the powers contained in the Customs and Excise Acts and enactments amending those Acts, certain goods namely

10,000 (No ) cigarettes  
633 6 litres of beer  
144 litres of spirits

If you claim that the said goods are not liable to forfeiture you must within one month from the date of this notice of seizure give notice of your claim in writing in accordance with paragraphs 3 and 4 of Schedule 3 to the Customs and Excise Management Act 1979

If you are outside the United Kingdom and the Isle of Man you must also give the name and address of a solicitor in the United Kingdom who is authorized to accept service of process and act on your behalf

If you do not give notice of claim within the said period of one month or, if any requirement of the above-mentioned paragraph 4 is not complied with, the goods in question will be deemed to have been duly condemned as forfeit

If you do give notice of claim in proper form, the Commissioners will take legal proceedings for the condemnation of the said goods
