

If any person desires to question the validity of the Order, or of any of the provisions contained therein, on the grounds

- (a) that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990, or
- (b) that his interests have been substantially prejudiced by a failure to comply with any of the requirements of the Act,

he may, within 6 weeks of 17th August 1998, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein
