Westininster, April 10. .

IS Majefty came this Day to the Houfe of Peers, and being in His Royal Robes feated on the Throne, with the ufual Solemnity, Sir William Oldes, Gentleman Ufher of the Black Rod, was fent with a Meffage from His Majefty to the Houfe of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the Houfe of Peers; the Commons being come thither accordingly, His Majefty was pleafed to give the Royal Affent to two publick and to one private Bill, viz.

An Ast for granting an Aid to His Majesty by a Land Tax in Great-Britain for the Service of the Year One Thousand Seven Hundred Seventeen.

An Act for enlarging the Time granted by an Act passed in the Eighth Year of the Reign of Her late Maje/ty Queen Anne, intituted, An Act for making a convenient Dock or Bason at Liverpoole, for Security of all Ships trading to and from the said Port of Liverpoole.

An Act for Naturalizing Isaac Kuyckvan Misop.

St. James's, April 12.

An humble Addrefs of the High Sheriff, Grand Jury, Deputy Lieutenants, Juftices of the Peace, and other Gentlemen of the County of Monmouth, at the Affizes held for the faid County on Thurfday, March 21, 1716-17, has been prefented to His Majefty by Thomas Lewis, Efq; one of the Knights of the Shire for the faid County, introduced by his Grace the Duke of Grafton.

Which Addrefs His Majely was pleafed to receive very gracioully.

Vienna, April 3. The Letters from Tranfilvania advife, that upon General Mercy's putting under Contribution that Part of Walachia which is fituated beyond the River Alautha, and is still in the Posseffion of the Turks, Mauro Caudato, Brother to him that was lately taken at Buchorest, applied himfelf to the Tartars for Protection, who accordingly came to his Relief; but instead of 800 Men. that were defired, they brought

8000, who plundered the Province, and carried off all they could: Whereupon Mauro Cordato fent to treat with General Mercy, and agreed with him to pay 25000 Florins a Month Contribution, whereof the firft monthly Payment is actually made. Prince Eugene is returned hither from Moravia: All things are preparing for a vigorous Campaign. The General Rendezvous of the Army is indeed put off from the 15th of April to the 12th of May, but then it is refolved to take the Field and enter upon Action. 'Tis faid the Imperial Army will be divided into two Bodies, one of which, under Prince Eugene, is to form the Siege of Belgrade, while the other, commanded by General Mercy, is to obferve the Motions of the Turks, it being not yet known whether they will endeavour to hinder the Siege, or make a Diverfion in Tranfilvania.

Drefden, April 7. The Queen has been very much indifpoled, for fome Days, at Torgaw. Letters from Warfaw of the 31lf of laft Month give an Account, that the Day before, at Six in the Morning, the King imbarked on the Viftula, having no more Poles in his Retinue than the Staroff Branicky and a Gentleman of Podolia: His Majefty propofed to ftop but four Days at Dantzick, and then to proceed to Leipfick by the Way of Torgaw. Letters from Venice of the 26th of laft Month advife, that the Electoral Prince of Saxony will not fet out from thence fo foon as was believed, fo that he will not arrive in this Country till the Fair of Leipfick is over.

Copenhagen, April 10. The Deal-Caffle, a Britifh Man of War, commanded by Captain Willis, arrived here on the 5th Inftant. He brought in with him two Ships which he retook from the Swedes in the North Sea, one of them is a large Dutch Fly-Boat laden with Wine and Brandy, the other is the Packet-Boat which carried from Holland the Mail for England of the 19th paft; but the Mail for England was taken by the Swedifh Privateer, who having put fome of his Men into these two Veffels, went to cruife again. By Letters from Norway we learn, that a Danifh Privateer has taken a Swedifh Ship laden with Iron and Copper, bound for France. There are in this Port fifteen Danifh Men of War, War, in a Readiness to put to Sea. In a few Days the King will go to take a Review of his Troops in Laland, and the other Islands.

Bruffels, April 15. Letters from Vienna advife, that the Imperial Court will fuspend the thorough Settlement of the Government of the Auftrian Netherlands till after the enfuing Campaign is ended, when Prince Eugene is to come hither to regulate the Affairs of this Country. The Affembly of the Communities of this Place, called the feven Nations, perfift in their Refufal to confent to fo large a Subfidy as is de-manded of them. The Magistrates of Mons and Courtray have been changed. On the 12th Instant Count Tschernini, of Bohemia, was married to the Daughter of the Marquels of Wefter-Last Night, about Eight o'Clock, the Jon. Czar arrived here, and was received with all due Honours by the Marquess de Prié. His Majesty has chosen to lodge in a House called Chailes the Fifth's, but that of Bournonville is is fitted up for his Retinue.

Hague, April 16. The States General, who have been affembled fome Days, have had under Confideration the Affair of the Barrier; and fome of the Members have had a Conference with the Deputies of the Council of State, about regulating the Finances. Letters from Guelderland advife, that the King of Pruffia has caufed a Camp for thirty thouland Men to be marked out between Rees and Emmerick; and that his Pruffian Majefty intends to be there by the End of May, to take a Review of that Body of Mr. Whitworth, who has been for Troops. fome Time at the Court of Berlin, in the Quality of His Britannick Majefty's Envoy Extraordinary, arrived this Evening, and is to refide here (being vested with the same Character to their High Mightinesses) during the Absence of the Lord Cadogan: Mr. Leathes, who has born the Character of a British Resident fince his Lordship's Departure, is preparing to return to his former Refidence at Bruffels, affoon as his Health will permit.
