War, in a Readiness to put to Sea. In a few Days the King will go to take a Review of his Troops in Laland, and the other Islands.

Letters from Vienna ad-Brussels, April 15. vise, that the Imperial Court will suspend the thorough Settlement of the Government of the Austrian Netherlands till after the ensuing Campaign is ended, when Prince Eugene is to come hither to regulate the Affairs of this Country. The Assembly of the Communities of this Place, called the seven Nations, persist in their Refusal to consent to so large a Subsidy as is demanded of them. The Magistrates of Mons and Courtray have been changed. On the 12th Inflant Count Tschernini, of Bohemia, was married to the Daughter of the Marquels of Wester-Last Night, about Eight o'Clock, the Czar arrived here, and was received with all due Honours by the Marquess de Prié. His Majesty has chosen to lodge in a House called Charles the Fifth's, but that of Bournonville is is fitted up for his Retinue.

The States General, who Hague, April 16. have been assembled some Days, have had under Consideration the Affair of the Barrier; and some of the Members have had a Conference with the Deputies of the Council of State, about regulating the Finances. Letters from Guelderland advile, that the King of Prussia has caused a Camp for thirty thousand Men to be marked out between Rees and Emmerick; and that his Prussian Majesty intends to be there by the End of May, to take a Review of that Body of Mr. Whitworth, who has been for fome Time at the Court of Berlin, in the Quality of His Britannick Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary, arrived this Evening, and is to refide here (being vested with the same Character to their High Mightinesses) during the Absence of the Lord Cadogan: Mr. Leathes, who has born the Character of a British Resident since his Lordship's Departure, is preparing to return to his former Residence at Brussels, assoon as his Health will permit.
