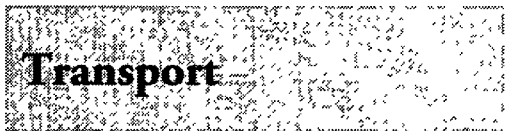

## Road Traffic Acts

### London Borough of Southwark

THE LONDON BOROUGH OF SOUTHWARK (WAITING & LOADING RESTRICTIONS) (AMENDMENT NO. 125) TRAFFIC ORDER 1999

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Southwark, on 20th July 1999, made the above-mentioned Order under sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended by the Local Government Act 1985 and Road Traffic Act 1991

The general effect of the Order would be to alter the Southwark (Waiting & Loading Restrictions) Traffic Order 1976 so as to

(a) extend waiting restrictions in Crawford Road and King and Queen Street,

(b) introduce waiting restrictions in Curtis Street, Dean's Buildings, King and Queen Street, Madron Street, Notley Street, Victory Place and Willow Walk

PROPOSED STOPPING-UP OF A HIGHWAY OFF SHREWSBURY STREET, OLD TRAFFORD
