Take notice that J A Elson, of Elms Farm, Stourdon Lane, Thringstone, Leicestershire LE67 8US is applying to the Environment Agency for a licence to abstract water from a borehole drilled into the Bromsgrove & Polesworth Sandstone, and the Moira & Hopwas Breccia, at National Grid Reference SK 4211 1847, at Elms Farm, Stourdon Lane, Thringstone, Leicestershire LE67 8US

The proposal is to abstract water at the following rates: 4 cubic metres per hour, 40 cubic metres per day, and 14,600 cubic metres per annum. Consumption will be all year. The abstraction of water is required for the operation of a dairy unit, general farm washing facilities and the possible feeding of a family dwelling.
