Brussels, Oct. 7. The Inauguration of the Emperour, as Duke of the Province of Brabant remains fixed to Monday the 11th Instant; and the Magnificence with which it will be solemnized, will very much surpass what was done for either of the three last Sovereigns of the Austrian Netherlands. 'Tis said the Marquess de Prié designs to appoint the Count de la Noye, and the Prince of Ruempre, to be his Procurators at Mons and Namur for the like Ceremony. 'Tis advised from Vienna, that when the Campaign in Hungary is ended, Prince Eugene has determined to make a Journey hither. Baron Hohenborff, who was that Prince's Adjutant General, and now Governour of Aeth, lies still here, that the Physicians have given him over.
