THE A339 TRUNK ROAD (HEADLEY) (40 AND 50 MILES PER HOUR SPEED LIMITS) ORDER 200

Notice is hereby given that the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority, as the local planning authority, has determined that the part of Bainbridge, which is more particularly described below, is an area of special architectural or historic interest, the character or appearance of which it is desirable to preserve or enhance and accordingly has designated the said area as a Conservation Area in pursuance of the provisions of section 69 of the Planning (Listed Building & Conservation Areas) Act 1990.

The part of Bainbridge, which as been so designated, is as follows:

Beginning at the south-east abutment of Yore Bridge, Grid Reference SD 9335 9072, the boundary of the designated area continues eastwards along the south bank of the River Ure until it crosses the confluence with the River Bain to meet the length of wall east of that river at Grid Reference SD 9354 9074. The boundary runs southwards along this wall to rejoin the east bank of the River Bain at Grid Reference SD 9350 9064, whence it diverts slightly at Grid Reference SD 9345 9052 to run southwards along the perimeter of the treatment works. Turning abruptly, it continues around the perimeter and then north north-east before turning southwards to include field No. OS 5138. The boundary changes direction at Grid Reference SD 9359 9028 to run eastwards along the wall to the north of the Roman fort in field No. OS 6817, changing at Grid Reference SD 9388 9035 to run southwards and then east to include field No. OS 8511. The boundary then turns west and then runs south along the east boundary of the cemetery. Crossing the A684, the boundary runs along the north wall of field No. OS 6394 before crossing to run southwards along the western side of the Stalling Busk Road until SD 9342 8975. 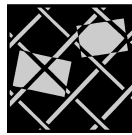

(i) goods or chemical mixtures which contain one per cent or less by weight of a chemical listed in Category A of Schedule 2;

(ii) goods or chemical mixtures, which contain ten per cent or less by weight of a chemical listed in Category B of Schedule 2; or

(iii) consumer goods that are either packaged for retail sale for personal use or packaged for individual use."

This instrument shall come into force on 29th April 2000.
