Madrid, October 25.

VOllonel Stanhope, His Britannick Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary, has fince his Arrival here been at the Escurial, and has had several Confe-rences with Cardinal Alberoni. Their Catholick Majefties continue at the Efcurial, and this being the Anniversary of the Queen's Birth-Day, a good Number of the Nobility are gone thither from hence to make their Compliments on the Occasion. The King is well recovered from his late Indisposition, and frequently takes the Diversion of Hunting. The Court will return to the Royal Palace in this City on the 27th In-ftant, and then Mr. Bubb will have his Audience of Leave of their Majefties, in order to fet out on his Return to England the 3d of next Month. A Canon of the Cathedral of Cuenza having lately written and published a Paper, in which he afferts that the Clergy are not in the present Juncture under any lawful Obligation to pay the Subfidy which was granted laft by the Pope to his Majesty to be employed only against the Infidels, has been proceeded against in the Ecclesiaflical Court; and in Confequence of the Cenfure paffed upon him by that Court, an Order has been fent him to depart the Kingdom forthwith. The Archdeacon of Carmona in Andalusia, has also been censured by the fame Court, for asserting (though not in such direct Terms) the like Position. Don Geezalo Chacon is nominated to go and command in Chief on the Island of Sardinia. The Duke of San Pedro is made Captain-General of the Kingdom of Valencia, in the Room of the Marquess de Valdecannas.

Berne, Oct. 23. The Sovereign Councils here being adjourn'd for fomeWeeks, by Reafon of the Vintage Seafon, which according to Cuftom has produced a Vacation of all Bufinefs at this Place, a Prince of Saxony.

Stop has likewife been put to the Treaty of an Accommodation between the Abbot of St. Gall and the two Cantons of Zurich and Berne, concerning which a Minifter of that Abbot has later ly made fome new Propositions: But 'tis likely, that the fame will be reviv'd as foon as the Vintage is over, and the Councils meet again.

Brussels, Nov. 1. On the 30th past in the Evening the Marquess de Prié returned hither from the Journey he had made to view Bruges, Newport and Oftend, the Cannon on our Ramparts firing as he entered the Town., Yefterday he appeared in Publick, and received the Compliments of all the Perfons of Diffinction .t this Court: At Noon he went with the Lual State accompanied by his two S ns, to the Church of the Jefnies, and affited at the Service perform d e for her pofe of the Souls of the Offcers and Soldiers who were kild in Hungary this laft Campaign again le Turks. 'Tis faid his Excellency b ing illformed when he was at Otend, that the Mouth of the Harbour there is fo choaked up, that 'tis in Danger of becoming useless, has refolved to fet a Number of Men to work to clear it, and to ap-propriate a confiderable Sum of Money to that Service.

Vienna, Off. 30. We have no Advice yet of the Aga's-Return from the Ottoman Court to Belgrade. Count Fleming is named Ambaffadour Extraordinary from the King and Republick of Poland to this Court, and is fhortly expectly here. The publick Bufinefs of this Embaffy, is to defire the Emperour to infift, at the future Treaty of Peace with the Turks, on the Demolition of Choczim, a Place of the Frontiers of Poland which the Turks have fortified contrary to the Treaty of Carlowitz; but 'tis furmifed he will alfo be inftructed to ask in Marriage the Elder of the Arch-Dutcheffes for the Electorat Prince of Saxony.

Bells, Illuminations, and Bonfires. This Day His Majesty was pleased to come from Hampton-Court to St. James's, to make a Visit to Her Royal Highness on this happy Occasion, and to fee the young Prince; and afterwards went back to Hampton-Court.
