

Vizier had retired thither ; but that three Days before the said Captain left that Place, the Governour received Orders to seize the Vizier, and to send his Head to the Grand Signior, which was done accordingly.

Vienna, Nov. 3. Several Letters from the Frontiers say, there is a Report that the Grand Signior is deposed ; but there is no certain Advice of it. We have an Account from Hungary, that a Detachment of several Thousand Men, with some Cannon and Mortars, is marching from Belgrade, in order to attack Zwornick a second Time, as is supposed, the Design being yet kept secret. 'Tis reported, that M. Tolstoy, the Russian Minister, who lately went from hence to Naples, with the Consent of this Court, to engage the Czärowitz to return home and submit to the Czar, is actually set out with that Prince for Petersburg.

Hambourg, Nov. 9. Letters from Dresden advise, that the King of Poland will in a short Time return into that Kingdom, attended by most of the Polish Nobility and others who are now in Saxony. The chief Reasons for this Journey, are, 1. That according to the last Convention his Majesty is obliged to reside one Part of the Year in Poland. 2. To fill up the vacant Offices and Employments, which cannot be done in his Absence. 3. To convene the lesser Diets in all the Palatinates, and to ratify what was last concluded with respect to the Finances and the Payment of the Army. 4. To perfect the Instructions for Count Fleming, who is to go to Vienna in the Quality of Ambassadour from the King and Republick of Poland. The last Advices from Warsaw tell us, that the Russian Troops continue their March from Poland thro' Livonia and the Ukraïn; and that the Czar had sent his Auditor-General, named Kreutz, into Great Poland, with Orders to make strict Inquiry into the Behaviour of the Russian General Officers and others in their last Winter-Quarters, and to take an exact Account of the Contributions they collected from the Towns and Villages.
