Madrid, January 10.

N the 6th Inftant the Courier returned who had been difpatched to Rome, for the Pope's Bulls to qualify Cardinal Alberoni to hold the Archbishoprick of Seville. He brought back the Opinion of the College of Cardinals, that those Bulls could not be iffued, conformably to the Holy Canons, before Proof was made by an Inftru-ment paffed in due and legal Form, that Cardinal Alberoni had actually renounced the Bishoprick of Malaga to which he was first promoted. Whereupon fuch an Inftrument having been executed, was fent away Yesterday by another Express. We have Advice from Cadiz, that affoon as the Intendant Patino arrived there, he gave Orders for delivering all the Effects brought by the last eight Ships from New Spain, to the Perfons concerned, deducting on-ly 5 per Cent. for the Indulto on Silver, i and an half per Cent. on Gold, and 8 per Cent. on other Goods. The Re-mittances which were ready to have been made to Holland, for fome Ships of War that were ordered to be bought there, are ftopt; because of certain Difficulties newly rifen, which have obftructed the Contracts that were making for those Ships. 'Tis advised from Barcelona, that a confiderable Number of Water-Casks for Shipping are providing there, as also abundance of Mangers and other necessary Accommodations for carrying Horfes by Sea; and 'twas reported, that a good Number of Troops is to be transported from thence to Sardinia, which Island is defigned for a Place of Arms, in Cafe the War be carryed further. On the 2d Inftant the Conde de Salvatierra put on his Hat in the King's Prefence as Grandee of Spain, on which Occasion there was a general Appearance of the Grandees.

Copenbagen, Jan. 11. Last Week arrived here from Holftein, feveral Waggons with Money, amounting in all to here, and four Counfellours of the fame

120000 Rixdollars. Which Sum is to be made use of for paying the Troops. Tis thought very lucky that this Mo-ney was collected in Holftein before the Inundation, which has ruined the finest and richest Part of that Country; as also that the Cavalry which had long been quartered there, were by the King's Order come over to this Island a little before. 'Tis computed that the King will lofe this Year, and perhaps the next fucceeding Year or two, 300000 Rixdollars of his Revea nue in Holftein, besides the Expence of repairing the Dykes, and enabling the Peafants to fettle again in that Part of the Country which was overflowed. We have had no Advices from Norway fince the 18th of laft The Transports laden with Month. Provisions for that Country will fail from hence in a few Days, with the Baggage of feveral General Officers who are already fet out to go by Land as far as Flastrand.

Berne, Jan. 19. The Conferences at Baden about the Affair of St. Gall go on with Succefs. Those who are there on the Part of the new Abbot and Chapter were for making a fresh Treaty; but the Deputies of the two Cantons having declared to them, that they could not by their Inftructions proceed upon any other Foot than that of the old Convention of Roschach, those of St. Gall acquiefced in it and produced their Grievances, fo that now this Matter is in full Negociation, and has a fair Appearance of being foon brought to a happy Conclusion. It is faid Commiffions have been fent from France for buying 2000 Horfes in this Canton, and 1000 more at Lucern for remounting their Cavalry. The Officers of this Canton, who are in the Service of France, have likewife demanded Permission to raise Recruits here for their Companies, which has been granted.
