ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

THE A52 TRUNK ROAD (DERBY ROAD, NOTTINGHAM) (BUS/CYCLE LANE) (EXPERIMENTAL) ORDER 2001

The Secretary of State for the Environment, Transport and the Regions hereby gives notice that he has made an Order, under sections 9(1) to (3) and 10(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, on the A52 Trunk Road at Nottingham.

The effect of the Order, which comes into force on 26th March 2001, is to create a bus/cycle lane on the nearside lane of the eastbound carriageway of the A52 Trunk Road from the centre of its roundabout junction with Ilkeston Road, the B5010 and Town Street (known as Sherwin Arms Junction) to a point 75 metres west of its roundabout junction with Wollaton Vale and Woodside Road (Known as Priory Roundabout).

The Order will be in operation for an experimental period of up to 18 months from the date the Order comes into force. The Order contains a provision under section 10(2) of the Act allowing a specified officer (The Divisional Director) to modify or suspend the operation of the Order or any provision of it if it appears to him essential in the interests of the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of traffic.

A copy of the Order, a plan illustrating the proposal and a statement explaining why the Secretary of State has made the Order may be inspected, during office hours, at the offices of Nottinghamshire County Council, Environment Department, Trent Bridge House, Fox Road, West Bridgford, Nottingham NG2 6BJ; Broxtowe Borough Council, Foster Avenue, Beeston, Nottinghamshire NG9 1AB, or obtained by application to Karen Eustace at the Highways Agency, Project Services Secretariat, Broadway, Broad Street, Birmingham B15 1BL.

The Secretary of State will be considering in due course whether the provisions of the Order should be continued in force indefinitely. Any person wishing to object to the making of the Order for the purpose of continuing the restrictions in force indefinitely should send, between 26th March 2001 and 26th September 2001, a written statement of his or her objection and of the grounds thereof to Karen Eustace at the address given above.
