PROPOSED COAST PROTECTION WORKS AT EAST PIER, CASTLE HEADLAND AND THE HOLMS, SCARBOROUGH

The Scarborough Borough Council, acting in its capacity as Coast Protection Authority, hereby gives notice, under subsection (1) of section 5 of the above Act, that it proposes to carry out coast protection works as described herein, at Scarborough, North Yorkshire.

The work will consist of:

- the construction of a revetment consisting of a combination of Accropode concrete units and rock armour on the seaward side of East Pier and Marine Drive extending from the southern end of East Pier to a point 50 metres south-east of the junction of Royal Albert Drive and Albert Road;
- maintenance and repair work to rehabilitate and strengthen East Pier;
- reconstruction of the parapet of East Pier between 100 metres and 340 metres from its southern end;
- the construction of a wave return wall on the seaward side of Marine Drive, extending from the East Pier to a point 50 metres south-east of the junction of Royal Albert Drive and Albert Road.

The estimated cost of the works is £20.6 million.

Details of the works proposed, together with an Environmental Statement, can be inspected at the address shown below.

NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR A LICENCE TO ABSTRACT WATER

Take notice that Abington Farms Ltd, of Abington Park Farm, Great Abington, Cambridgeshire CB1 6AX, is applying to the Environment Agency for a licence to abstract water from chalk strata, at National Grid Ref. TL 814 688, at Stanchils Farm, Hengrave, Bury St. Edmunds, Suffolk IP28 6NB.

The proposal is to abstract water at the following rates: 164 cubic metres per hour, 3,636 cubic metres per day, 318,200 cubic metres per year, between 1st January and 30th September each year.

The water will be used for spray irrigation and discharge to a reservoir for subsequent spray irrigation.
