ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

A36 TRUNK ROAD (BATHAMPTON LANE JUNCTION) (PROHIBITION OF VARIOUS TRAFFIC MOVEMENTS) ORDER 2001

The Secretary of State for Transport, Local Government and the Regions hereby gives notice that he made this Order on 16 July 2001 coming into force on 20 July 2001, on the A36 Trunk Road at Bathampton Lane Junction, Bath. The notice of the proposal to make it (Ref HA41/29/19) was published in Issue No 55872 of *The London Gazette* on 12 June 2000 and the effect of the Order is as described in that notice.

A copy of the made Order and of a plan illustrating the effect of the Order and the alternative route (via Down Lane) may be inspected during office hours at the offices of Bath Central Library, The Podium Bath and Bathampton Post Office, High Street, Bathampton.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the above Act, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act, or of regulations made thereunder, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks from 16 July 2001, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or any provision contained therein.

THE CROYDON (WAITING AND LOADING RESTRICTION) (AMENDMENT NO 10) ORDER 2001

1. Notice is hereby given that the London Borough of Croydon on 16 July 2001 made the above-mentioned Order under sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by the Local Government Act 1985.

2. The general effect of the Order would be to further amend the Croydon (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 2000 so that waiting by vehicles would be prohibited:

(a) between 8.00 am and 6.30 pm Monday to Friday inclusive in Valley Road, the south-west side, between its junction with Kenley Lane and its junction with Church Road;

(b) between 1.00 pm and 2.00 pm Monday to Friday inclusive in those lengths of Oaks Way and Park Road as specified in the Schedule to this notice.

3. The Prohibition referred to in paragraph 2 above will not apply in respect of anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform or in certain circumstances, eg the picking up or setting down of passengers; the carrying out of statutory powers or duties; the taking in of petrol etc, from roadside petrol stations; to licensed street traders etc. The usual exemption relating to vehicles displaying a disabled persons' "Badge" will apply.

4. A copy of the Order, which will come into operation on 23 July 2001 of the Croydon (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 2000 (and of any Order which has previously amended that Order) can be inspected during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, until the end of 6 weeks from the date on which the Order was made at the Enquiry Counter, "One Stop" Facility, Taberner House, Park Lane, Croydon, Surrey.

5. Copies of the Order may be obtained from the Traffic, Parking and Civil Engineering Division of the Public Services and Works Department, Room 4.06, Municipal Offices, Fell Road, Croydon.

6. Any person desiring to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any of the relevant requirements thereof, or of any relevant regulations made thereunder have not been complied with in relation to the Order may, within 6 weeks of the date on which the Order was made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

Oaks Way, from the common boundary of Nos 1 and 3 Oaks Way to a point 10 metres north-west of the north-western kerbline of Oaklands Gardens.

Park Road, the south-east side, from a point opposite the south-western boundary of No 14 Park Road to a point 10 metres south-west opposite the south-western kerbline of Oaks Way.

THE CROYDON (FREE PARKING PLACES) (DISABLED PERSONS) (NO 6) TRAFFIC ORDER 2001

1. Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Croydon on 16 July 2001 made the above-mentioned Order under sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by the Local Government Act 1985 and the Road Traffic Act 1991.

2. The general effect of the Order would be to:

(a) revoke the disabled parking places located outside No 112 Broadcombe, South Croydon, outside No 64 Calley Down Crescent, New Addington, outside No 18 Ecclesbourne Road, Thornton Heath, outside No 32 Harcourt Road, Thornton Heath, adjacent to No 36 Huntly Road, South Norwood, adjacent to No 12 Dartnell Road in Kemerton Road, Addiscombe, outside No 23 Keston Road, Thornton Heath, outside No 1 Lynwood Gardens, Waddon, outside No 20 Netley Close, New Addington, outside No 80 Norhyrst Avenue, South Norwood, outside Nos 77A/77B Waddon Park Avenue, Croydon, outside No 5 Whitehall Road, Thornton Heath and outside No 23 Wiltshire Road, Thornton Heath;

(b) designate new parking places in Ashley Road, Thornton Heath (outside No 5), Bedwardine Road, Upper Norwood (outside No 53), Beulah Road, Thornton Heath (outside No 89), Braemar Avenue, South Croydon (outside No 42), Dalmeny Avenue, Thornton Heath (outside No 39), Friend's Road, Croydon (adjacent No 2 Barclay Road), Keston Road, Thornton Heath (outside Nos 35-37), Lavender Road, West Croydon (outside No 19), Mayo Road, West Croydon (outside Nos 4-6), Meadow View Road, Thornton Heath (outside Nos 31-33), Queen Mary Road, Upper Norwood (outside No 77), Sangley Road, South Norwood (outside Nos 50-52), Strathyre Avenue, Norbury (outside No 55), Sundridge Road, Addiscombe (outside No 54) and Wharfedale Gardens, Thornton Heath (outside No 82);

(c) provide that the parking places would operate "At Any Time";

(d) specify, in respect of the parking places, that disabled persons' vehicles displaying in the relevant position a disabled persons' badge issued by any local authority under the provisions of the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1975, 1982 or 2000 as amended, may be left therein; and

(e) provide that certain vehicles may wait in the parking places in certain circumstances, eg to allow persons to board or alight (maximum 2 minutes), to load or unload (maximum 20 minutes), etc.

3. A copy of the Order which will come into operation on 23 July 2001 and of all associated Orders can be inspected during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive until the end of 6 weeks from the date on which the Order was made, at the Enquiry Counter, "One Stop" Facility, Ground Floor, Taberner House, Park Lane, Croydon, Surrey.

4. Copies of the Order may be obtained from the Traffic, Parking and Civil Engineering Division, Public Services and Works Department, Taberner House, Park Lane, Croydon.

5. Any person desiring to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained therein on the ground that it is not within the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 or that any of the relevant requirements thereof or of any relevant regulations made thereunder have not been complied with in relation to the Order may, within 6 weeks of the date on which the Order was made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.
