THE STOPPING-UP OF HIGHWAY (COUNTY OF CAMBRIDGESHIRE) (NO 3) ORDER 2001

The Secretary of State for Transport, Local Government and the Regions hereby gives notice that, on the application of Hewitson Becke and Shaw, on behalf of Homerton Street Development Limited, he has made an Order under section 247 of the above Act entitled "The Stopping-up of Highway (County of Cambridgeshire) (No 3) Order 2001", authorising the stopping-up of highway land at Homerton Street, Cambridge to enable development consisting of 133 flats of which 14 will be live work units, 40 affordable housing units, student housing (300 rooms with two wardens flats) fire station, restaurant, health and fitness suite, conference room, community room, and commercial/retail to be carried out in accordance with the planning permission granted under Part III of the Act to Januarys Chartered Surveyors on behalf of Homerton Street Development Limited by Cambridge City Council, on 15 May 2001, under Ref C/00/0582 FP.
