Description of highway to be stopped up

The highway to be stopped up is in the London Borough of Tower Hamlets. It is shown edged black on the plan and are parts of the footway of Ellesmere Street and Alton Street, London E14. The area consists of an "L" shaped area of footway on the eastern corner of Ellesmere Street and Alton Street starting from the party wall of 30-34 and 36 Ellesmere Street extending eastwards along the southern footway of Ellesmere Street for a maximum length of 26.10 metres and southwards along the western footway of Alton Street for a maximum length of 10.65 metres, with a continuous width of 1.05 metres.

The stopping-up is to facilitate the redevelopment of 36 Ellesmere Street into 9 one-bedroom flats. (485)
