The Dutchess of Orleans has been very ill, but is recovered. The Dutchess of Vendosme was seized the 10th Instant at Night with a violent Fit of the Gout, and died the next Morning. A general Review of the French and Swiss Guards is appointed to be on the 19th Instant, at which the King intends to be present.

Hague, April 12. The Levy of Seamen for our Baltick Squadron is carryed on in these Provinces with great Diligence and Success, and two Months Pay being advanced to those listed for that Service, a great Number are, upon this Encouragement, come in from Foreign Parts; so that our Ships will very soon be compleatly Manned. The Works of the Citadel of Liege being entirely demolished, the Dutch Garrison evacuated that Place the 4th Instant, and marched to Maestricht; and Possession was taken of it by the Baron of Doblstein, who is appointed Governour by the Elector of Cologne, and by Arch-Deacon Van Stockheim. Letters from the North say, that Prince Alexander Petrowitz, the Czar's eldest Son, who was lately disinherited, has made his Escape from Moscow, and is thought to be fled into Germany.
