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Bermuda, February 16.

Ollonel Bennet, our Governour, having received from Great Britain his Majeity's Proclamation for suppressing Pirates, containing among other things a Promile of His Majefty's Gracious Pardon to fuch as shou'd surrender themselves, sent a Sloop in December last with divers printed Copies of it to Providence, one of the Bahama Islands, being their chief Rendezvous, where the faid Proclamation was received with great Demonstration of Joy and Thankfulness by the Pirates, who at that Time happened to be there, declaring they would, as Opportunities offered for their transporting themselves from thence to His Majefty's Plantations, lay hold of the King's Marcy, and furrender themfelves to the Governours thereof, and that they did not doubt but their Conforts, who were out a Cruizing, when they heard of the Procla-mation, would do the like : Accordingly Captain Henry Jennings and 15 others are arrived here, and have furrendred themfelves, and they have brought Letters from Leflie and Nichols, both Commanders of Pirate Sloops, promifing to come with a good Number of their Men and furrender themfelves likewife, who are daily expected.

Vienna, April 5. General Count Rhetteimb went from hence on the 3d Inftant for Raab. The fame Day a confiderable Number of Recruits arrived here from the Emperour's Hereditary Countries, which were imediately fent forward by Water for Hungary. Orders are fent to Croatia to get a Train of Artillery and a great Quantity of Ammunition ready, and to make the other neceffary Preparations for the Siege of Bihatż: After the taking of that Caftle it is proposed to attack Zwornick; the taking of which two Places would make the Imperialists Masters of all Bolnia. They write from Transilvania, that a Body of Imperial Troops being fent from thence into Moldavia and Walachia, had raised Contributions in those Provinces to a very confiderable Sum.

Provinces to a very confiderable Sum. Berne, April 6. The Deputies of this Canton are expected here this Evening from Baden; those of Zurich and St. Gall are likewife gone to their respective Homes; but they have all left their Secretaries at Baden to carry on the Negotiation for settling the Matters in Dispute between the Abbot of St. Gall and the neighbouring. Cantons, and they are to return thither son after the Easter Holydays to put the last Hand to that Treaty, which is in great Forwardnels. Letters from

Milan fay, General ~Zumjungen was arrived there from the Imperial Court ; that Count Staremberg was fet out from thence for Vienna; and that they were at work on the Repairs of the Fortifications of the Citadel of Milan and those of Tortone, Mantua, Cremona and Picighittone.

Drefden, April 13. The Express which lately brought from Warlaw Advice of the Arrival there of the Capigi Bashaw, with the Character of Ambassiadour from the Ottoman Port, is sent back with an Invitation to him to come to this Place; and Orders are sent to the King of Poland's Minister at Vienna to procure the necessary Passforts for the faid Ambassadour's being permitted to travel through the Imperial Territories in his Journey hither. The Body of Saxon Troops which the Emperour has lately taken into his Service, is ordered to be a Readiness to march by the 25th of this Month. The Prince of Saxe Weissenfelds is on his Departure hence to to Weissenfelds, to make a Visit to the Duke Regent his Brother, who is dangerously ill of a Dropfy.

Paris, April 16. The Duke and Dutchefs of Lorrain are set out from hence in order to return to Nancy, the Place of their Refi-dence, and have expressed themselves extremely fatisfied with the Honours that have been paid them, during their Stay at this Court. The Limits between the French Territories and those of Savoy and Piedmont, are fully adjusted between the Marshal d'Huxelles on the Part of his most Christian Majesty, and the Count de Provana who was employed in that Negotiation by the King of Sicily. Our Troops are ordered to march in May next in order to change their Quarters. The feveral Branches of the publick Revenue being now entirely fettled by the Care of M. d'Argençon Keeper of the Seals, they will Mortly be let out to farm to the best Bidders, who fhall be able to give fufficient Security for the Performance of their Contracts. They write from Lisbon, that the Spanish Troops that were quartered on the Frontiers of Portugal, towards Badajos, having been ordered to march to other Quarters along the Sea Coafts of Andalusia, and the Court of Portugal having received fresh Affurances from that of Madrid of their fixed Resolution to maintain a perfect Amity and good Correfpondence between the Two Crowns, the fit-ting out of feveral Men of War and other warlike Preparations that had been begun in Portugal were laid afide, and they only conthe
