THE A6 TRUNK ROAD (BEDFORD TO CLAPHAM) (TEMPORARY 40 MILES PER HOUR SPEED RESTRICTION) ORDER 2001

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Transport, Local Government and the Regions has made an Order on the A6 Trunk Road in the county of Bedfordshire to allow for the construction of a new roundabout in conjunction with Clapham Bypass.

It is expected that the works will take place from 00.01 am on Monday 15 October 2001 and last for approximately 18 months. The Order will come into force on 8 October 2001 and continue until the work is completed.
