Corporation of London REDUCTION OF ON-STREET RESIDENTS PARKING SPACES

- 1. Notice is hereby given, that the Common Council of the City of London propose to make Orders under section 6 and under section 45 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.
- 2. The number of on street residents parking spaces in the Golden Lane area would be reduced from fifteen to nine spaces to equal the number of permit holders in that area. The effect of the Orders, would be:
- (a) in Fann Street, to convert part of a residents parking place to a disabled persons parking place consisting of one bay;
- (b) in Baltic Street West, to convert a residents parking place to a disabled persons parking place consisting of two bays and extend another residents parking place by one bay;
- (c) in Charterhouse Square to convert a residents parking place into a disabled persons parking place consisting of two bays and to extend an existing metered parking place by two bays;
- (d) in Golden Lane, to convert part of a metered parking bay to a disabled persons parking place consisting of one bay.
- 3. The disabled persons parking bays would be free of charge, and available for City "Red Badge" holders at any time. "Blue and Orange Badge" holders would be able to use the parking places after 10.00 am on Mondays and Fridays subject to a maximum stay of three hours.
- 4. A copy of each of the proposed Orders, of the City of London (Free Parking Places) (Disabled Persons) Order 1994, of the City of London (Parking Places) (No 4) Order 1994, of the City of London (Residents Parking Places) Order 1995, of the Common Councils statement of reasons for proposing to make the Orders and of plans showing the affected streets can be inspected during normal office hours on Monday to Fridays within a period of 21 days from the date on which this notice was published at the Department of Planning and Transportation, Guildhall, London E.C.2.

NOTICE OF PROPOSAL TO MAKE TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT ORDER

- (b) "No stopping between 11.00 pm to 8.00 am Monday to Sunday" except for buses at all bus stands in lengths of: Barry Road.

NOTICE OF (PEDESTRIAN CROSSINGS) TRAFFIC ORDER 2001/098
