HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

THE A1 TRUNK ROAD (A645 SLIP ROADS AND A162 SLIP ROADS) (DETRUNKING) ORDER 2001

The Secretary of State for Transport, Local Government and the Regions, hereby gives notice that he has made the following Order:

An Order under sections 10 and 12 of the Highways Act 1980 entitled the A1 Trunk Road (A645 Slip Roads and A162 Slip Roads) (Detrunking) Order 2001 which provides that four slip roads leading to and from the A1 Trunk Road to be superseded by A1 (M) Ferrybridge to Hook Moor scheme shall cease to be trunk roads, and shall be classified as classified roads, as from the date on which the Secretary of State notifies the North Yorkshire County Council and Wakefield Metropolitan District Council (who will become the highway authorities responsible for the slip roads within their area) that the motorway is open for traffic.

Copies of the Order can be purchased through booksellers or direct from government bookshops (The Stationery Office). The A1 Trunk Road (A645 Slip Roads and A162 Slip Roads) (Detrunking) Order 2001 is numbered SI 2001/3524 and is priced £2.65.

Any person aggrieved by an Order mentioned in this notice who desires to question its validity, or the validity of any provision in it, on the ground that—

- (a) it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980, or
(b) any requirement of that Act or of regulations made under that Act has not been complied with in relation to that Order,

may apply to the High Court within 6 weeks from the date of first publication of this notice. On such an application, the Court may suspend or quash that Order or any provision in it.

Notice is hereby given that Eurotech Environmental Limited had applied to the Environment Agency for an Integrated Pollution Prevention and Control (IPPC) permit to operate an installation involving the treatment and storage of Special Wastes. The installation is located at Northern Road, Newark, Nottinghamshire NG24 2EU in the District of Newark and Sherwood District Council in the County of Nottinghamshire.

The application contains a description of any foreseeable significant effects of emissions from the installation on the environment. Information relating to the above IPPC application for a permit to operate the Northern Road Treatment Site is held in registers at the following locations:
