ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

THE A52 TRUNK ROAD (GRANTHAM ROAD, RADCLIFFE ON TRENT, NOTTINGHAMSHIRE) (40 MILES PER HOUR SPEED **LIMIT) ORDER 2002**

The Secretary of State for Transport, Local Government and the Regions hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under sections 84(1)(a) and (2) of, and paragraph 27(1) of Schedule 9 to, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, on the A52 Trunk Road at Radcliffe on Trent in the county of Nottinghamshire.

- (d) provide that certain vehicles may wait in the parking places in certain circumstances, eg to allow persons to board or alight (maximum 2 minutes), to load or unload (maximum 20 minutes), etc.
