NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR A LICENCE TO ABSTRACT WATER

Take notice that Bourn Farming Partnership, of Gills Hill Farm, Bourn, Cambridge, is applying to the Environment Agency for a licence to abstract water from Greensand Strata at National Grid Ref TL 3306 5583 at The Camp, Bourn Golf Club, in the parish of Bourn, in the district of South Cambridgeshire, in the county of Cambridgeshire.

The proposal is to abstract water at the following rates: 5.5 cubic metres per hour, 91 cubic metres per day, 9,092 cubic metres per year—between April and October each year. The water will be used for spray irrigation. A copy of the application and any map, plans and other documents submitted with it may be inspected, free of charge, at all reasonable hours at Gills Hill Farm, Bourn, Cambridge, between 26 April 2002 and 26 May 2002.
