This Day the Right Honourable Nicholas Lechmere, Esq; was, by His Majesty's Command, sworn of His Majesty's most Honourable Privy Council, and took his Place at the Board accordingly.

Venice, July 1. By Letters from Corfu of the 12th past, by the Way of Otranto, we have Advice that the Captain General Pisani is sailed with the Gallies to Zant, where the Fleet waits his Excellency's Arrival, confisting of 25 Ships of War well manned and provided with all Necessaries, and expecting to be joined foon by the Maltese Squadron. fame Letters say, the Ottoman Fleet is come to Napoli di Romania, and consists of 25 Sail. Admiral Grimani, with two Men of War and 16 Transports, is sailed to the Coast of Albania, having on board General Schuylemberg, with a Regiment of Italians, 300 Germans, 26 Engineers, and all Necessaries for undertaking a Siege; but it is not known what Place he will attack. At Lido arrived this Week the Battalions of Verona, and of Padua, confisting each of 500 Men. This Week also is expected that of Rurigo of 450 Men, besides several independant Companies. All these are to be fent to Dalmatia for reinforcing the Army there, which is to join the Army in Albania that is commanded by General Schuylemberg, and the Proveditore General Mocenigo is to stay at Sebenigo to cover that Frontier. This Week the great Council has chosen into the Nobility Sig. Charles Zini, with his to Sons, five of whom are to be Priests, and so are excluded from all Benefit of their Nobility.

Rerne, July 6. The Deputies named on the Part of this State for the General Diet of the Helvetick Body, are arrived at Baden, where the French Ambassadour, the Marquess D'Avaray, was likewise expected on the 4th Instant, which Day was appointed for opening the faid Diet. Two Deputies from Neufchatel had Audience on the 4th of the Sovereign Council here, to whom they delivered a Memorial complaining of this Canton's prohibiting the bringing of their Wines into this Country, and fetting forth their Privileges and the Right they had acquired by the Treaty of Comburghership with this State, to sell their Wines in these Parts. Whereupon a Commission has been appointed by the said Sovereign Council to examine their Pretensions, and to make report. They write from Milan the 28th past, that the Governour of that Dutchy had begun to form a Camp near Vercelli, which was faid to confift of 10000 Men; that the Militia had likewise received Orders to be ready to march whenever it should be required; and that great Diligence was used in repairing the Fortifications of Pavia and Novara.

Hambourg, July 8.
