HIS Majesty in Council was this Day pleased to appoint John Evans, Esq; Sheriff for the County of Montgomery, in the Room of his Father Francis Evans, Esq; deceased.

Warsaw, July 15. The King of Poland is expected here from Dresden towards the End of next Month, about which Time a General Diet of the Kingdom and Republick of Poland is to be held at Grodno; and the Univerſalia, or Writs of Summons, for assembling the particular Diets of the several Palatinates to chuse their Deputies to this general Meeting, have been issued some Time since. An Envoy is come from the Cham of Tartary, who intends to wait here his Majesty's Arrival, and in the mean Time is entertained at the publick Expence. The Turkish Envoy who lately had Audience of his Majesty at Reiffen, is returned home. There has happened an Insurrection of the Rabble at Lemberg, who plundered the Houses of the Jews in that City, and killed several of them; but divers of the Ringleaders have been seized, and are to suffer exemplary Punishment. The Muscovite Forces, commanded by General Reppin, which were quartered in the Palatinate of Wilna, marched from thence the 3d Instant towards Dantzick, in order to oblige the Inhabitants of that Town to perform the Conditions on their Part of an Agreement they made with the Czar when his Forces were formerly in their Neighbourhood. A Fire happened lately at Zolkiew, a Town belonging to Prince Sobiesky, the greatest Part whereof has been consumed.

Cologne, July 29. The Elector Palatine intending shortly to remove from Duffeldorp to Heidelberg, the Palace there is ordered to be fitted up for his Reception. The Magistrates of the Town of Ratisbon on the 21st Instant paid Homage, and took the Customary Oath to the Emperour before the Cardinal of Saxe Zeiss, his Imperial Majesty's Commissary. Some Letters from Dresden say the King of Poland is very much indisposed. We have just now received by an Express from Vienna the happy News of the Conclusion of the Peace with the Turks, which was signed at Passarowitz the 21st of this Month by Sir Robert Sutton, Ambassadour Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary from

His Majesty of Great Britain, and the Ambassadour and Plenipotentiary of the States General as Mediators, and by the respective Plenipotentiaries of the Emperour, the Republick of Venice, and the Ottoman Porte.

Hague, Aug. 2. The 31st past the Baron de Heems, his Imperial Majesty's Minister, received an Express from the Imperial Court with an Account of the Treaty of Peace being signed at Passarowitz between the Emperour and the Republick of Venice on one Part, and the Ottoman Porte on the other: The Baron de Heems immediately notified the welcome News to the Great Pensionary, and to the Foreign Ministers and other Persons of Distinction residing here, who have since made him their Compliments of Congratulation upon this happy Occasion. The States General have had under Consideration the State of War or Military Establishment for the ensuing Year, laid before them by the Council of State, to which they have made some small Alterations, and have since sent it to the States of the several Provinces for their Approbation. The States of Holland and West Friseland are still assembled, but will adjourn the 6th Instant for a few Weeks. The Heer de Bye, Resident from this Republick at Moscow, is recalled; no other Person is yet appointed to succeed him in that Employment. We hear the States of the Province of Zealand have resolved to give their Consent to this Republick's entring into the Alliance to which they are invited by the Emperour, the King of Great Britain, and the most Christian King, for restoring the Peace and Quiet of Christendom. The Sieurs de Capelle, Lestevenon and Volters, being deputed by the States General to reconcile the Differences between the City of Groningen and the Ommelands, set out from hence for Groningen the 30th past. Our Letters from Petersbourg say, that since the Death of the Czarowitz Orders have been given for the seizing of several Persons of Note, who are accused of being concerned in the Traiterous Practises wherein he was engaged against the Czar his Father.
