ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

THE A646 TRUNK ROAD (ROSSENDALE ROAD, BURNLEY) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER

The Secretary of State for Transport gives notice that he intends to make an Order under sections 1(1) and 2(1) and (2) and 4(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The Order if made as proposed will prohibit vehicles, from waiting at any time on any day, on the north-eastern side of the A646 Trunk Road (Rosendale Road) in the district of Burnley, from a point 44.5 metres north-west of the centreline of Farrington Road to a point 21.5 metres south-east of the centreline of Farrington Road.

Exceptions to the waiting prohibition have been provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to be used:

- in connection with any building operation or demolition;
- for the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
- for the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the trunk road or services therein;
- for vehicles being used for emergency purposes by the police, fire brigade or ambulance services;
- for anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police constable in uniform or of a traffic warden;
- by a local authority or water company in pursuance of their respective statutory powers or duties;

for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets;
or, when the person in control of the vehicle is required to stop:
by law;
in order to avoid an accident;
due to circumstances outside the person's control;
or a vehicle waiting on the trunk road for so long as may be necessary:
for any person to enter or leave that vehicle, or
for goods to be loaded or unloaded from that vehicle.

A copy of the Order, together with a plan and a copy of the Secretary of State's reasons for proposing to make the Order, have been deposited at Burnley Borough Council, Engineering Services, 20 Nicholas Street, Burnley, Lancashire BB11 2AP, and Highway Consultancy, Winkley House, Cross Street; Preston PR1 8RD; where they may be inspected during opening hours, or may be seen at or obtained by application to the Director, The Highways Agency, Operations Division, Room 810, Sunley Tower, Piccadilly Plaza, Manchester M1 4BE.

Any person wishing to object to the Secretary of State's proposals to make the Order should send a written statement of their objection and the grounds thereof to the Director's address given above, quoting HA 41/5/64, and must be received no later than Friday 14 February 2003.
