THE CROYDON (OFF STREET PARKING PLACES) (NO 1)
TRAFFIC ORDER 2004

- 1. Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Croydon on 5 April 2004 made the above-mentioned Order under sections 32, 35, 124 of, and Parts I to IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended by the Local Government Act 1985 and the Road Traffic Act 1991.
- 2. The general effect of the Order will be to revoke an area formally designated as an off street parking place in Wellington Road, Broad Green.
- 3. A copy of the Order, which will come into operation on 13 April 2004 (and of any Orders which have previously amended those Orders) can be inspected during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, until the end of 6 weeks from the date on which the Order was made at the Enquiry Counter, "One Stop" Facility, Taberner House, Park Lane, Croydon, Surrey.

- 4. Copies of the Order may be obtained from Parking and Departmental Support Services, Environmental, Cultural and Sports Services Department, 1st Floor, Davis House, Robert Street, Croydon CR0 1QQ.
- 5. Any person desiring to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 or that any of the relevant requirements thereof or of any relevant regulations made thereunder have not been complied with in relation to the Order may, within 6 weeks of the date on which the Orders were made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.
