The following Letters Patent were signed by Her Majesty The QUEEN on the 7 April 2004 in respect of the Vulnerable Witnesses (Scotland) Bill asp 3.

ELIZABETH THE SECOND by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and of Our other Realms and Territories Queen Head of the Commonwealth Defender of the Faith To Our trusty and well beloved the members of the Scottish Parliament

GREETING:

FORASMUCH as a Bill has been passed by the Scottish Parliament and has been submitted to Us for Our Royal Assent by the Presiding Officer of the Scottish Parliament in accordance with the Scotland Act 1998 the short Title of which Bill is set forth in the Schedule hereto but that Bill by virtue of the Scotland Act 1998 does not become an Act of the Scottish Parliament nor have effect in the Law without Our Royal Assent signified by Letters Patent under Our Scottish Seal (that is Our Seal appointed by the Treaty of Union to be kept and used in Scotland in place of the Great Seal of Scotland) signed with Our own hand and recorded in the Register of the Great Seal We have therefore caused these Our Letters Patent to be made and have signed them and by them do give Our Royal Assent to that Bill COMMANDING ALSO the Keeper of Our Scottish Seal to seal these Our Letters with that Seal.

Road Traffic Acts *London Borough of Tower Hamlets* THE TOWER HAMLETS (PRESCRIBED ROUTE) (NO 2) ORDER 2004

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY that the Council of the London Borough of Tower Hamlets, on 16th April 2004 made the above mentioned Order under section 6 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by the Local Government Act 1985 and the Road Traffic Act 1991. 2. The general effect of The Tower Hamlets (Prescribed Route) (No 2) Order 2004 will be to prohibit vehicular traffic from proceeding in;

(i) Ford Square (its northernmost arm) other than in a general eastbound direction;

(ii) Ashfield Street between its junction with Ford Square (its northernmost arm) and Sidney Street, other than in a general eastbound direction;

3. A copy of the Order which will come into operation on 30 April 2004 can be inspected, by prior appointment, at the offices of Environment and Culture, Traffic and Transportation Section, 60 Southern Grove, London E3 4PN, during normal office hours on Monday to Fridays inclusive, until the expiration of a period of 6 weeks from the date on which the Order was made.

4. Any person desiring to question the validity of the Order or of any provision provided therein on the grounds that it is not within the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any or the relevant requirements thereof or any relevant regulations made thereunder have not been complied with in relation to the Order, may within 6 weeks of the date on which the Order was made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

THE BIRMINGHAM CITY COUNCIL (NORTHFIELD RELIEF ROAD) (A38 CLASSIFIED ROAD) (SIDE ROADS AND OTHER WORKS) ORDER 2002

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he has confirmed with modifications the above Order which was made by Birmingham City Council under sections 14 and 125 of the Highways Act 1980 and which, as confirmed, authorises the Council to:

- (a) improve highways;
- (b) stop up highways;
- (c) construct new highways;
- (d) stop up private means of access to premises; and
- (e) provide new means of access to premises;

all on or in the vicinity of the route of the classified road known as the A38 Northfield Relief Road which the Council are proposing to construct to the west of Northfield Centre, connecting with the existing A38 Bristol Road South, near Great Stone Road at its southern end, and St Laurence Road at its northern end.
