1. Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Hammersmith and Fulham proposes to make the above-mentioned Order to ensure public safety on football match days and to cover ancillary activity at Craven Cottage Stadium under sections 6, 122, 124 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (a) as amended by the Road Traffic Act 1991 (b).

2. The Order comes into operation on 2 August 2004, and the general effect of the Order would be to permit a Police Officer in uniform to close in whole or in part thereof and to restrict waiting and loading on public highways in the vicinity of the Craven Cottage Stadium, as specified in Schedule 1 and 2 to this notice, before, during and after football match fixtures, so as to ensure the safe movement of football supporters and other pedestrians on football match days, to and from football match fixtures held at this stadium whilst permitting the movement, waiting, loading and unloading of passenger carrying vehicles, Police, Ambulance and Fire Brigade vehicles, television outside broadcast vehicles or any other essential vehicles authorised by the Council.

3. The proposed Order (A) would be enforceable when signs are in place up to three hours before the commencement of play of any football match fixture at Craven Cottage Stadium and cease to be enforceable one hour after the final whistle that ends play of that football match fixture as set out in Schedule 1 to this notice.

4. The proposed Order (B) would amend waiting restrictions in sections of Fulham Palace Road between Inglethorpe Street and Lillie Road to be enforceable at any time as set out in Schedule 2 to this notice.

5. The proposed Order (C) would be enforceable at any time when signs are in place before and during any football match fixture at Craven Cottage Stadium and up to three hours following completion of the match fixture

6.
