The Hardships they suffered at Sea. and in as cold and barren a Place as any in Scotland, had brought a Sickness among them, so that several of them are dead. Some Advices say, that they had actually transported most of the Foreigners to the Lewes. came in two Ships only, with about 400 Soldiers.
