THE GREENWICH (WAITING AND LOADING RESTRICTION) (AMENDMENT NO 151) ORDER 2004

1. Notice is hereby given that Greenwich Council, hereinafter called the Council, on 29 November 2004, made the above-mentioned Order under sections 6 and 124 of, and Part IV of Schedule 9 to, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.

2. The general effect of the waiting and loading Order will be to impose waiting restrictions operative at any time on the lengths of streets specified in the Schedule to this notice.

Details of exemptions from the restrictions for certain vehicles and persons, together with restrictions on selling or advertising in a restricted street are contained in the original Order of 1994.

40 MPH SPEED RESTRICTION—NORTH PERIMETER ROAD

Notice is hereby given that Heathrow Airport Limited (being a wholly owned subsidiary of BAA plc), proposes to make an Order under sections 84(1) and (2) Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, having effect by virtue of sections 1, 2 and 65 of the Airports Act 1986.

The general nature of this Order would be to enforce a 40 mile per hour speed restriction on the Northern Perimeter Road for a distance of 1.1 miles (1,770 metres) from the junction with and including the Enfield Roundabout, to a point immediately prior to the junction with Nene Road.

THE A49 TRUNK ROAD (DINMORE HILL, HEREFORDSHIRE) (50 MILES PER HOUR SPEED LIMIT) ORDER 200

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he intends to make an Order under sections 84(1)(a) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, on the A49 Trunk Road at Dinmore Hill in the county of Herefordshire.
