NEW ROADS AND STREET WORKS ACT 1991

NOTIFICATION OF SUBSTANTIAL ROADWORKS

In accordance with section 58 of the New Roads and Street Works Act 1991 3 months advance notice is hereby given that Transport for London (Highway Authority) intends to carry out substantial works for road purposes. The streets in which these works will take place are as follows:

A3 Long Road, Lambeth A205 London Road, Lewisham A2216 Dartmouth Road, Lewisham A3205 Battersea Park Road, Wandsworth A205 Upper Richmond Road, Wandsworth

Works are expected to affect the carriageway of Long Road at the junction with Clapham Common south side and Victoria Street; London Road at the junction with Wood Vale and Davis Road; Dartmouth Road for a length of some 20 metres from its junction with A205 London Road; Battersea Park Road at the junction with Queenstown Road and Falcon Road; Upper Richmond Road at the junction with Colinette Road and Ravenna Road.

Works are expected to commence in March 2005. Subject to the exemption in the Act and Regulations under it, no street works may be expected for a period of 12 months from the completion of the works described in paragraph 5 without the consent of the said Highway Authority/Roads Authority, which shall not be unreasonably withheld.

TAKING EFFECT ON 1 JANUARY 2005

The Civil Aviation Authority ("CAA"), in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 73, 74, 75 and 79 of the Transport Act 2000^(a), hereby makes the following Specification:

Citation and commencement

1. This Specification may be cited as the Civil Aviation Authority (Denmark and Iceland Charges) Specification 2005 and shall take effect on 1st January 2005.

Revocation

2. The Civil Aviation Authority (Denmark and Iceland Charges) Specification 2004 is hereby revoked.

Interpretation

3.—(1) In this Specification—

"NSL" means NATS (Services) Limited, a company incorporated in England and Wales with number 4129270 whose registered office is at 5th Floor South, Brettenham House, Lancaster Place, London WC2E 7EN.

(2) Unless otherwise defined in this Specification and unless the context otherwise requires, expressions used in this Specification shall have the same respective meanings as in the Transport Act 2000 and the Air Navigation Order 2000^(b).

Charges for services provided by the Governments of Denmark and Iceland

4.—(1) In respect of each crossing between Europe and North America by an aircraft, wherever registered, in the course of which the aircraft is at any time north of the 45th parallel North between the meridians of 15° West and 50° West, the operator of the aircraft shall, upon completion of the crossing, pay to NSL a charge of £59.06 computed as follows—

in respect of chargeable air services provided by the Government of Denmark for such crossings £13.50.
