PENWITH DISTRICT COUNCIL (OFF-STREET PARKING PLACES) ORDER 2005 VARIATION NO 1

Notice is hereby given that the District of Penwith in exercise of its powers under section 35(1) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended by the Parking Act 1989 and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Act and of all other enabling powers with the consent of the County Council of Cornwall in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act made the following Order.

The details of the proposal to make the Order were previously published in *The Cornishman* and *The London Gazette* on 19 January 2006 and in *The St Ives Times and Echo* on 20 January 2006.

The Order shall come into operation on 1 April 2006 and may be cited as the Penwith District Council (Off-Street Parking Places) Order 2005 Variation No 1. The effect of the Order will be to vary the charges for the Council's off-street parking places as set out in Schedule 2.

Any person who wishes to question the validity of the Order or any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers contained in the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act or of any instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks from 1 April 2006 apply to the High Court for this purpose.
