ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984, SECTION 14(1)(A), (7) AND 15(2)

THE M1 MOTORWAY (JUNCTION 6-JUNCTION 11)

## THE M10 MOTORWAY (M1—JUNCTION 1) AND THE A414 TRUNK ROAD (TEMPORARY RESTRICTION AND PROHIBITION OF TRAFFIC) (NO 2) ORDER 2006

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Transport has revoked an existing Order and has made a new Order on the M1 and M10 Motorways and the A414 Trunk Road in the counties of Hertfordshire and Bedfordshire to allow works to take place in connection with the widening of the M1 between Junction 6A and Junction 10
The effect of the Order will be to:

1. impose a 50 miles per hour speed restriction on:
(a) the M1 between a point 523.3 metres south of the centreline of Chequers Lane underbridge, (south of Junction 6A) and a point 3,034.8 metres north of Caddington footbridge, (north of Junction 10); and
(b) the M10 between its junction with the M1 at Junction 7 and its junction with the A405 at Junction 1;
2. impose a 40 miles per hour speed restriction on:
(a) the length of M1 described at 1(a) above;
(b) the length of M10 described at 1(b) above;
(c) the A414, Breakspear Way between its junction with the M1 at Junction 8 and its roundabout junction with Green Lane;
(d) the link road leading:
(i) to or from the M1 at its junction with the M25 Motorway (M1 Junction 6A);
(ii) to or from the M1 at its junction with the M10 Motorway (M1 Junction 7); and
(iii) between M1 Junction 10 and Junction 10A;
(e) any slip road leading to or from the M1 at any junction between Junction 6 and Junction 11 inclusive;
3. close various lanes of the northbound and southbound carriageways of the M1 described in 1(a) above and allow traffic to use the opposite carriageway in a contraflow manner
4. allow traffic to run on the hard shoulders of the northbound and southbound carriageways of the M1 and M10 described in 1(a) and (b) above;
5. prohibit vehicles with an overall width exceeding $6^{\prime} 6^{\prime \prime}$ from entering or proceeding in the length of M1 described in 1(a) above; and
6. close at different times the link roads, the slip roads and the A414 described in 2(c), (d) and (e) above.
7. close at different times, various lengths of the northbound and southbound carriageways of the M1 described in 1(a) above.
The work is expected to last for approximately three years and will be carried out in phases as indicated by traffic signs. Contraflow and hardshoulder running will operate 24 hours a day and slip road, link road and A414 closures will take place overnight between 9.00 pm and 5.00 am . The Order will come into force on 29 May 2006.

Vehicles being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes will be exempt from the speed limits, closures and width restriction. Vehicles being used in connection with the works will be exempt from the closures and width restriction. Vehicles being used by Highways Agency traffic officers will be exempt from the closures
Diversion routes will be well signed.
