TRANSPORT AND WORKS ACT 1992

The National Assembly for Wales ("the Assembly") gives notice pursuant to section 14(1)(a) of the Transport and Works Act 1992 ("the Act") that it has determined under section 13(1) of the Act to make, with modifications which in its opinion make no substantial changes to the proposals, the Pontypool and Blaenavon (Phase 1) Railway Order 2006 ("the Order").

The Order was applied for by the Pontypool and Blaenavon Railway Company (1983) Ltd of The Railway Shop, 13A Broad Street, Blaenavon, Torfaen NP4 9ND.

The Order makes provision for the transfer from BRB (Residuary) Ltd to the Pontypool and Blaenavon Railway Company (1983) Ltd of statutory and other powers and duties relating to the existing railway, extending from a point at the northern terminus at Whistle Road Bridge to the southern terminus to the south east of Blaenavon High Level

Station, in the county borough of Torfaen. In addition the Order makes other provisions as to the railway.

Mr Carwyn Jones, the Assembly Minister for Environment, Planning and Countryside, has made the Order, with modifications, in accordance with Standing Orders of the Assembly and the conclusions of a Planning Decision Committee which agreed with the assessment made by an inspector who recommended that the Order should be made.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990

The Secretary of State hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 247 of the above Act to authorise the stopping-up of 4 cul-de-sac roads, one Heathfield Gardens as leads off Langdon Gardens, and 3 unnamed as lead southwards off Rogerley Terrace, together with the network of footpaths, all of which lie to the south of Rogerley Terrace and to the north of Prince's Street; of three footpaths, 2 of which connect Prince's Street and the footpath which lies to the rear of York Street and 1 of which connects that latter footpath with the footpath which lies to the rear of Nos 1 to 11 Regent Street; and a length of that latter footpath as extends from Prince's Street to the northern boundary of No 1 Regent Street, all at Catchgate, Stanley, County Durham.

If the Order is made, the stopping-ups will be authorised only in order to enable the development described in the Schedule to this notice to be carried out in accordance with outline planning permission granted to and by Derwentside District Council on 7 September 2004, under Ref 1/2004/0717/DCOP, and the reserved matters planning permission granted by Derwentside District Council to Brosley Homes Limited on 22 February 2006, under application Ref SW/1/2005/1032/DMFP.

Copies of the draft Order and relevant plan may be inspected at all reasonable hours during 28 days commencing 8 June 2006, at the offices of Catchgate Sub Post Office, Hobsons Buildings, North Road, Stanley, and may be obtained, free of charge, from the Secretary of State at the offices of the Department for Transport (quoting Ref GO-NE/06/5053/35/06) at the address stated below.

Any person may object to the making of the proposed Order within the period of 28 days commencing 8 June 2006, by notice to the Secretary of State, quoting the above reference, at the offices of the Director, Environment Group, Government Office for the North East, Citygate, Gallowgate, Newcastle upon Tyne NE1 4WH.
