Berne, Nov. 29. The Tumult which happened lately at Biene. is appeased by the Intervention of this State; the Citizens of that Place having laid down their Arms, set at

Liberty the Prisoners they had taken lately upon Suspicion of having had a Design to carry off their Burgomaster, and drawn off the Guards from the House of the Bishop of Porentru's Receiver, whom they suspected of favouring that Design. The Secretary of this Canton who was sent to the said City upon the first Notice of this Uproar, remains there still, and endeavours to bring all the Differences between the Bishop and his Subjects to an Accommodation. M. Holzhalb, one of the Burgomasters or Chief Magistrates of the Canton of Zurich, is lately dead there, and M. Ulrich, the Proconsul of that State, has succeeded him in that Dignity.

Copenhagen, Nov. 30. The King of Denmark having ratified the Convention made with Great Britain the 30th of October, and the Lord Polwarth having received His Britannick Majesty's Ratification of the same; those Ratifications were exchanged last Night. Letters from Stockholm of the 11th past advise, that the Lord Carteret had a private Audience on the 6th of her Swedish Majesty, when he first took upon him the Character of Ambassadour.

Hague, Dec. 12. Most of the Deputies of the States of Holland are already arrived here, in order to hold an Assembly To-Morrow. The Marquess Beretti Landi has caused the two last Letters of Cardinal Alberoni, which he communicated to the Deputies of the States General, to be printed and dispersed.
