The King of Denmark having ratified the Convention made with Great Britain the 30th of October, and the Lord Polwarth having received His Britannick Majesty's Ratification of the same; those Ratifications were exchanged last Night. Letters from Stockholm of the 11th past advise, that the Lord Carteret had a private Audience on the 6th of her Swedish Majesty, when he first took upon him the Character of Ambassadour.
