Efferday a Convention for the Evacuation of Sardinia, was concluded and figned by Admiral Byng, Count Mercy, and the Marquess de Lede; and the latter has difpatched Orders to the Caprain-General of that Ifland, to make the neceffa-ry Difpolitions for evacuating it. The Caftle, Mole, and City of Palermo are to be put into the Hands of the Imperialitis To-Morrow.

Copenbaren, Mey 28. It is not doubted the first Letters from Stockholm will bring an Account of Sir John Norris being arrived, with the British Fleet under his Command, on the Swedish Could. He had the Wind very fair for four or five Days alter his Departure from hence.

Paris, June 2. An Arrêt of the King's Council of State, dated the 29th of May, was published two Days ago, for deterring to the 1st of July the Dimi-nution on the Money which was to have begun on the 1st Instant, for making current again the feveral Coins of Gold and Silver which had been prohibi-ted, and for allowing all Perfons to import Gold or Silver Cuftom-free. This Morning was published another Arrêt dated the 1st Inflant, fetting forth, that whereas his Majefty had by an Arrêt of his Council of the 28th of January laft, permitted Search to be made in all his Subjects Houles, even in Monaficries and Convents, and in privileged Places, for Money that might he hid; had by an Arret of the 27th of February forbidden all Perfons, on Penalty of Con-filcation and of a Fine of 10000 Livres, to keep by them more than 500 Livres in Specie; and had alfo by the forementioned Arrît of the 29th of May permitted Gold and Silver Coin to be current again; his Majefty does now allow all Perfons to have and keep in Majetty does now allow all verifons to have and keep in their Poffefion whatever Sums of Money they think fit. On the 31ft paft in the Morning Collonel Stan-hope proceeded irom hence for Madrid. *Hague, June* 4. The Marque's Beretti Landi, Am-baffadour of Spain, having received the Ratifications of the King his Mafter's Act of Acceffion to the Treaty

of Quadruple Alliance, has notified it to the Imperial, British, French, and Sardinian Ministers; and they

Brithh, French, and Sardinian Ministers; and they have agreed to meet To-Morrow, and exchange the feveral Influments of Ratification. It is advifed from Stockholm, that the Treaty of Peace between the Crowns of Sweden and Denmark, was upon the Point of being concluded. *Windfor, May* 24. This Day the Right Honoura-ble Charles Earl of Sunderland, was installed Knight Companion of the most Noble Order of the Garter in the Royal Chapel of St. George, within the Col-lego of the Caftle of Windfor, by the Dukes of Newcaftle and Kingfton, Knights Companions of the faid Order, commillioned thereto by the Sovereign faid Order, commillioned thereto by the Sovereign under the Great Seal of the Order : The Atchievements of the late Duke of Schomberg were first offered by the Knights Commillioners; and when all the utual Geremonies had been performed in the Cha-pel, the Proceffion was made from thence through the great South-Door of the Church up to the Calile 3 and the Knights Companions, and Officers of the Order, the foreign Ambaffadours, with a great Num-ber of the Nobility, and other Perfons of Quality and Diffinition, were forendidly entertained at Dinner in the Council-Chamber. nizen, wi ereby the King loseth his Cuftom, Subsidy, or other h's Right or Duty, fuch Perfon will not only forfeis and h's Right or Duty, Juch Perfon will not only forfeit and lofe the Goods or Merchandize fo Cufformed, and the Value thereof, but alfo forfeit and lofe all his own Goods and Chattels Perforal for ever, one Morety of which Forfeiture to be to His Majeffy, and the other Morety to him or them that will fue for the fame : Of which this Notice is given, that no Perform may through Ignorance incur the afore-sid Forfeitures. And the faid Commiffioners do hereby further give Notice, That if any Perfon or Perfons will give them, or the Principal Officers of the Cufforms in any Port Information of the before-avointioned Fraudt. fo as Pors, Information of the before-mentioned Frauds, fo as the Perfons concerned therein may be profecuted and convitted, he or they shall have and receive for his or their Encouragement, the Officers Share of what shall be recovered, after the Charges of Profecution are deducted.
