*Palermo, May 28.*

**T**HE Spaniards have begun to ship their Baggage on board the Transports, which are continuing to get ready with all Diligence; and in a few Days those Troops will be embarked, which are designed to be sent off with the first Convoy.

*G noa, June 11.* This Morning the Princess of Modena proceeded on her Journey from hence: As the Ceremonial could not be adjusted, the Balls and other Diversions designed for her were forborn. The French Gallies which came with her, are making ready to put to Sea To-Morrow to return to France; but their Admiral the Chevalier d'Orleans, having been indisposed for some Days, will remain here till he recovers his Health.

*Berne, June 12.* The Deputies appointed by this State to attend the Bishop of Porentru concerning the Affairs of Bienne, set out the 7th Instant for the Execution of their Commission. The same Day our Sovereign Council assembled to chuse its Deputies for the next General Diet of Midsummer. One of the Treasurers of this State, and another Member of the Little Council, were accordingly named for that Purpose; though usually one of the Avoyers or Chief Magistrates of the Canton, who is out of Office, is the first Representative for the State at the said Diet. But he happening not to be able to undertake the Journey by reason of his great Age and Infirmities, the said Treasurer supplies his Room. Repeated Orders have lately been sent to all the Bailiffs of this Canton, to seize one Merveilleux of Neufchatel; who, contrary to the late Proclamations of this State, has listed Soldiers in these Parts for the Service of the Mississippi Company.

*Paris, June 25, N. S.* Sir Robert Sutton, His Britannick Majesty's Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary to this Court, arrived here on the 16th Instant. On the 18th he had a Conference with the Archbishop of Cambray, Secretary of State, and the 19th had Audience of the Duke Regent, to whom

he delivered his Credential Letters, and also a Letter from the King his Master congratulating his Royal Highness on the Marriage of his Daughter the Princess of Modena. This Day Sir Robert Sutton had his first Audience of his most Christian Majesty.

*Whitehall, June 13.* His Majesty has been pleased to create Sir Marcus Beresford of Cutraghmore in the County of Waterford in Ireland, Baronet, a Baron and Viscount of that Kingdom, by the Name Stile and Title of Baron Beresford of Beresford in the County of Cavan, and Viscount Tyrone.

This Day the Lord Kinsale was presented by his Grace the Duke of Grafton, Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, to the King, who was pleased to receive him very graciously, and he had the Honour to kiss his Majesty's Hand, and to assert the ancient Right of his Family of being covered in his Majesty's Presence.

John Rogerfon, Esq; is made Attorney General of the Kingdom of Ireland, in the Room of George Gore, Esq; who is made one of the Judges of the Common Pleas in that Kingdom.

*Whitehall, June 17.* On the 14th in the Evening His Majesty went from St. James's to Greenwich, and early the next Morning embarked on the Carolina Yacht for Holland.

*Whitehall, June 18.* The Earl of Stair, His Majesty's late Ambassador at the Court of France, arrived here on the 16th Instant.

Extract of a Letter to Mr. Secretary Craggs, which came by Express this Morning from Sir John Jennings.

*From on Board the Windsor off the Hinder, June 16, at Five in the Morning.*

**A**Bout 8 a-Clock Yesterday Morning I joined the King at the Nore with the Ships under my Command. I have the Pleasure to acquaint you, that the Yachts are now going over the Hinder into Goree. I have ordered the Captain of the Enterprize to forward this to you by Express, from the first Port in England which he may be able to reach.
