Algiers, May 26.

THE Differences which had been for some Time between this Government and the Emperour of Morocco, broke out into an open Rupture last Month, when the Bey of Oran advanced into the Dominions of the faid Emperour at the Head of 2500 Turkish Foot, and about 25000 Moorish Horse. There was a finall Skirmish between these Forces and those of the Emperour of Morocco, in which the latter lost about 60 Men: But it was immediately followed by a Peace.

Stockholm, June 21. The British Fleet under the Command of Sir John Norris, is come to an Anchor at the Dahlers, and the Admiral is come up hither. The States are at present busy in drawing up in Form all that has been concluded among them this Seffion, in order to pass the same into a Law, as is the Custom in this Country; and it is thought they may separate the Beginning of next Week. Mr. Finch the British Envoy, and Mr. Jackson the British Resident, had Audience of the King and Queen at Carlberg on the 18th Instant.

From on board the Barfleur in the Road of Naples, June 28, N. S. Admiral Byng staid at Palermo till the first Imbarkation of the Spanish Troops, consisting of about 12000 Foot and 600 Horse, sailed from Termini. They put to Sea on the 20th Instant, but the Weather being stormy that Day they were obliged to return into Port: On the 22d they sailed again with a fair Wind for Barcelona; whither all the Spanish Troops from Sicily are to be transported. That Day the Admiral sailed from Palermo for this Place. Another Imbarkation was preparing for the Remainder of the Spa-

nish Troops amounting to about 5000 Men, which it was proposed would put to Sea within 10 Days after the first : The Admiral left a Convoy for that Service. Transports were also provided to carry four or five Battallions of Piemontele to Sardinia, and the Admiral appointed them likewise a Convoy. They waited only for the Arrival of a Minister whom the Emperour is to send to take Possession of that Island in Form, and to refign it to the King of Sardinia's General.

Warsaw, July 3, N. S. We have Letters here which give an Account, that 4000 Muscovites had been detached from the Troops lying about Smolensko, and ordered by Prince Menzikow to take their March through Poland, as the shortest and best Way to Riga, where it seems they are thought necessary to reinforce the Garrison of that Place.

Pyrmont, July 4, O. S. His Majesty lest Herrenhausen on the 29th past, and came hither. His Majesty is in perfect Health: On the 1st Instant he began to drink the Waters of this Place, which agree very well with him. Earl Stan-hope fets out from Hanover on the 6th Instant for the Court of Berlin, where his Lordship proposes to stay about Ten Days, and then to come directly hither.

Copenhagen, July 9. The Lord Carteret waits here the Return of a Messenger he sent to Stockholm, upon his Danish Majesty's signing the Treaty of Peace with Sweden. The Gosport Man of War sailed on Saturday last from this Road, with a Ship with Brandy and other Provisions under her Convoy, to join the British Fleet commanded by Sir John Norris. The King and Prince Royal of Denmark came hither on the 4th Inflant, and returned again to Fredericksburg To-Day.
