THE EALING (FREE PARKING PLACES) (DISABLED PERSONS) (SPECIAL PARKING AREA) (AMENDMENT NO. 80) ORDER 2008

THE EALING (WAITING AND LOADING RESTRICTION) (SPECIAL PARKING AREA) (AMENDMENT NO. 347) ORDER 2008

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the London Borough of Ealing Council, in connection with an extension to the Ealing Broadway Controlled Parking Zone in the roads specified in the Schedule to this Notice and the creation of a new controlled zone for West Ealing in the area of The Avenue and Gordon Road, on the 23rd April 2008 made the above-mentioned Orders under sections 6, 45, 46, 49 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended by the Local Government Act 1985.

2. The general effect of the Ealing (West Ealing) (Residents Parking Places) Order 2008 will be:

(a) to introduce parking places for the use of residents and their visitors in lengths of Albany Road, Arlington Road, Sutherland Avenue, The Avenue (between Argyle Road and Waldeck Road) and Waldeck Road (between Denbigh Road and The Avenue);

(b) to provide that the parking places will operate in the periods between 9am and 10am and between 3pm and 4pm on Mondays to Fridays inclusive; and

(c) to provide that passenger vehicles, goods carrying vehicles, motorcycles and disabled persons vehicles may be left in a parking place without limitation on time during the controlled hours and that with the exception of motorcycles and disabled persons vehicles, a Zone HH valid permit or voucher must be displayed whilst parked therein.

3. The general effect of the Ealing (Ealing Broadway) (Residents Parking Places) (No. 2) (Amendment No. 4) Order 2008 will be:

(a) to introduce parking places for the use of residents and their visitors in lengths of Carlton Gardens, Carlton Road, Charlbury Grove, Castlebar Road, Oak Tree Close, Pinewood Grove;

(b) to provide that the parking places will operate in the periods between 9am and 10am and between 3pm and 4pm on Mondays to Fridays inclusive; and

(c) to provide that passenger vehicles, goods carrying vehicles, motorcycles and disabled persons vehicles may be left in a parking place without limitation on time during the controlled hours and that with the exception of motorcycles and disabled persons vehicles, a Zone W valid permit or voucher must be displayed whilst parked therein.

4. The general effect of the Ealing (Free Parking Places) (Disabled Persons) (Amendment No. 80) Order 2008 will be to introduce free parking places for vehicles displaying the disabled person's blue badge parking permit without limit on time in a length of Waldeck Road.

5. The general effect of the Ealing (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (Special Parking Area) (Amendment No. 347) Order 2008 will be to amend existing waiting restrictions or introduce new waiting restrictions that apply at any time or between the controlled hours of between 9.00a.m. and 10a.m. and between 3.00p.m. and 4.00p.m. on Mondays to Fridays in lengths of Albany Road, Arlington Road, Carlton Gardens, Carlton Road, Charlbury Grove, Castlebar Road, Oak Tree Close, Pinewood Grove, Sutherland Avenue, The Avenue (between Argyle Road and Waldeck Road) and Waldeck Road (between Denbigh Road and The Avenue). The lengths of double yellow line will be introduced mainly at junctions and include returns into Argyle Road.

6. W Zone and HH Zone Residents Parking Permits, as appropriate, will be available at a cost of £25 per annum and business users' permits available at a cost of £250 per annum.

7. Business Visitors Vouchers can be purchased at a cost of £1 per hour and Residents Visitors Vouchers can be purchased at a cost of 80p for use during two separate visits for the W zone and HH zone, as appropriate.

8. Borough wide vouchers will be available to park in either of the zones for £1 per hour.

9. The Orders, which will come into force on 1st May 2008, and other documents giving more detailed particulars of the Orders including a plan giving details of the proposed parking places, are available for inspection between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. Mondays to Fridays inclusive at Mouchel Limited, 6th Floor, 58 Uxbridge Road, Ealing, London W5 2ST, until the 4th June 2008.

10. Any person desiring to question the validity of any of the Orders or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 or that any relevant requirements thereof or any relevant regulations made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to any of the Orders may make application for the purpose to the High Court by the 4th June 2008.
