N the 16th Instant at Night Admiral Byng failed from hence in the Barfleur, with the Rupert, for Cagliari in Sardinia. On the 17th came in an English Transport in fix Days from Palermo, the Ma ster reports, that the Convoy and Transports with the Piemontele Troops sailed from thence on the 9th for Sardinia, where it is reckoned the Count d'Ottaiano, the Emperour's Minister, is by this time arrived, in order to receive the Possession of that Island from the King of Spain's Captain General there, and to deliver it to the Commander in chief of the King of Sardinia's Forces: When Admiral Byng has seen that done, he designs to return to Italy, and go to Hanover.
